
Nick Leavitt Senior Project Santi 5-8-14



The featured teams are randomized carousel that picks 5 teams to display out of the 32 teams in the World Cup. At the bottom is a blog about the latest news happening about the World Cup.




The schedule page includes all the groups that the teams are in, what day they play, time, the stadium, and the team they each play. Every team has their own page to link to and so does every stadium.



The tables/fixture page also includes the groups and the teams but they show the standing of each team and how they are doing. It also shows the matches played, won, draw, loss, goals for, goals against, and the total points in the group. The top two teams in each group advance into the next round.



Here is the home page for all the 32 teams in the tournament. It shows their countries flags all in alphabetical order and as you hover over the image the country name appears over the flag.



On the team page it shows a lot of information about each team. First off there is a small slider on the left that rotates between the country flag and the countries logo. It then tells you how each team made it to the World Cup and then a lot of facts about the team like their ranking in the world, nickname, top scorer, how many times they won the World Cup, etc. And below that it shows the group they are in and their schedule.
